




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Updated: April 19th / 3:30 pm ET // Policy Summary of Lead Parties

Canada's Relationship With Israel	Will move the Canadian embassy in Israel to Jerusalem. Will bring forward stronger laws in Canada to ensure the Jewish community is respected and protected.	Liberal leader was recently rebuked by Israel's Prime Minister for his remarks that seemed to indicate that he believed Israel was committing genocide in Gaza in their attempts to root out Hamas. He has not clarified these statements.
	The Conservative leader has made strong statements supporting Israel's right to defend itself from organizations whose goal is to destroy Israel completely.	
CBC Funding	Will defund the CBC; reallocate over \$1 billion in annual funding to other priorities. It will be transitioned to a not for profit and those who run it will need to figure out a financial plan that does not include taxpayer monies.	They will increase CBC funding. They view the broadcaster as essential.
	They argue the public broadcaster is biased and increasingly obsolete in the digital media age.	

Expansion of MAiD	Will oppose expansion of MAiD to include mental illness and minors; promise legislative rollback. Aim to reinforce life protections and align with concerns raised by medical experts and the UN.	Will support expanded access to MAiD for individuals with mental illness as the sole condition, considering MAiD for minors.
Abortion	The leader has said he will not change the current law on abortion. Will promote adoption. The CPC is currently the only party with official party status that will allow pro-life Canadians to run as candidates.	The party has a track record of giving millions of Canadian dollars to funding abortion internationally. The party has a track record of not allowing pro-life candidates to run under their banner and have a generally aggressive pro-abortion demeanour. Under Justin Trudeau, they said they would remove charity status for some pro-life groups.
Free Speech	Will repeal existing and proposed online censorship laws; protect freedom of expression on digital platforms as outlined in the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms. Concerned about overreach and suppression of political and religious views.	Will not repeal existing censorship laws and will introduce stronger online hate laws with an emphasis on hate speech, terrorism content, and misinformation. These terms will be defined by their government.

Gender Ideology & Surgery	At the 2023 policy convention a resolution was passed with overwhelming majority to oppose medical or surgical transition procedures for minors, though this is not an official platform in this current campaign. Conservative leader, Pierre Poilievre, commended Premier Danielle Smith on her stance to protect a child's right to make "adult decisions when they are adults."	Support public funding of gender change surgery and drugs such as puberty blockers. Justin Trudeau criticized Premiers who passed legislation requiring parents to be informed when their children want to change their name or gender at school.
Pipelines / Bill C-69	Will repeal Bill C-69 to eliminate regulatory bottlenecks; promote construction of cross-country pipelines; position Canada as a global energy supplier. Expected to stimulate job growth, especially in Alberta and Saskatchewan.	Will keep Bill C-69 in place to maintain environmental and Indigenous consultation standards; new pipelines only with strong provincial cooperation. This approach prioritizes climate goals and intergovernmental alignment over rapid development. Would also threaten national unity (Ref: Premier Danielle Smith).

Income Tax Reductions	Will reduce lowest income tax bracket from 15% to 12.75%, saving average workers about \$900/year; two-income families could save up to \$1,800.	Will lower marginal tax rate on lowest bracket from 15% to 14%, saving dualincome families up to \$825/year.
	This is designed to provide immediate relief amid inflation and rising costs of living.	
Housing Crisis Solutions	They will remove GST from purpose-built rental and new home construction under \$1.3 million.	They will create a new federal agency called: Build Canada Homes (BCH).

Focus on deterrence and protecting victims.	Will invest in crime prevention, mental health support, and police reform; maintain focus on rehabilitation. Tougher laws introduced for gun violence and organized crime, but less emphasis on incarceration.
Support for Seniors	Will increase Age Credit by \$1,000; eliminate capital gains tax for seniors downsizing homes; protect defined benefit pensions. Aimed at easing financial	Enhance GIS and OAS for low-income seniors; provide national dental coverage and expanded home care.
